month training period set up for the Americans was not enough. Macomber did manage a 16th in the slalom, but was 21st in the downhill, 13 seconds back of the great Colo. He was 48th in the Giant Slalom but was only one of three iron men on the United States team who entered all three races.

Dissatisfied with his performance, he followed the Europeans to Sun Valley, where they all entered the Harriman Cup races. Here he tied for ninth with Parvda of Austria in the downhill, was 17th in the slalom and 13th in the combined.

But two weeks later, his constant study of these great racers and their styles, plus a dogged determination to beat them at least once, paid off. He wrote a new page in American ski history when he won that great dash down the Nose Dive, for the Eastern Downhill championship and a close win over the great Austrian team who had won more points at the Worlds championships than all the other nations of the world combined.

**Mother Introduced Skiing**

George's mother, Janet, brought skiing to the family. She first learned the sport under the tutelage of a Norwegian while studying at Grenoble. She taught her husband, Ark, and then with him, taught the children. She is head of the Women's committee of the Eastern Ski Association at present, and staged the biggest and probably the finest women's Eastern Title event, ever held, at Middlebury College Snow Bowl, two weeks ago.

George's sister, Gail, won the Eastern Women's Downhill championship in 1948, so the family has profited well by the experience and counsel given by their parents.
