Racing on Hell's Highway with snow conditions perfect, a team of Dartmouth alumni took possession of the Dartmouth Alumni Shield for the first time in three years by nosing out the Ski Club Hochschule Sunday at Mt. Moosilauke. However, it was not in the downhill race that they were successful. The six-man team from the Boston club totalled 37 minutes, 12.6 seconds, in downhill, 1.2 seconds better than the alumni runners.

Individual downhill honors went to Roger Hollowell of S. C. H., who took the trail in five minutes flat, followed by his teammate, Sam Wakeman, in 5.09.4. First of the Dartmouth men in downhill was Don Allen, 5.23, followed by Lewellen White and Elmer Fulton, who were timed in 5.55 and 6.05.2 respectively. Elton Clark of the Hochschule was sixth with 6.08.4; Fordy Sayre of Dartmouth seventh in 6.10.2; John Carleton (D.), 6.30; J. A. Lowell (H.), 6.35.6.

Hochgebirge president, Charles Pier-son, and his teammate Justin Dempsey, engaged in a private duel of passing one another; that game proved upsetting when they hit a narrow curve together, with the result that Pier-son was tenth in 6.52.2, and Dempsey twelfth in 7.27. It was quite a day for the former, who broke a binding during the ascent of Hell's Highway, and took a spill during the slalom which left him almost out of sight, head first in a snow drift.

Any advantage the Boston skiers had was wiped out by the slalom results, although the slalom counts only one-half as much as the downhill in the scoring. Over a course laid out on the practice slope behind the old Ravine Camp, Don Allen led the field in 1.37.6, followed by two Dartmouth skiers who had not entered the downhill, Bob Ripley and Bill Dewey.

Team results gave Dartmouth a total time of 11.44.2 against 13.23.2 for the Ski Club Hochschule, with the combined point total reading 99.96 points for Dartmouth compared with 95.85. Individual times for the other slalom races were as follows:

Hollowell (H.), 2.01; Wakeman (H.), 2.01.4; Booth (D.), 2.07; Fulton (D.), 2.08.4; Carleton (D.), 2.09.2; Dempsey (H.), 2.14.6; Clark (H.), 2.15; Pier-son (H.), 2.25.4, and Lockwood (H.), 2.25.8.
